Résumé

This study determines and examines the consequences of malaria illness on farm household to mitigate the impact on farm production in Omor community. By demonstrating the economic consequences of malaria for household in irrigated farming areas, this study derived value in exposing further the need for the setting of environmental and health priorities to accompany agricultural and water resources development projects or activities. This study shows that household's members possess considerable amount of knowledge which guide their attitudes and practices towards malaria. It also shows that the consequences of malaria illness on household labour supply and farm production are not most adverse where the sick persons depend on wage labour, and in which case malaria caused partial and or complete disability means instant loss of cash earnings.
